North Yorkshire Together



North Yorkshire Together is a partnership between [North Yorkshire Sport](#), [North Yorkshire Youth](#) and [Rural Arts](#). We support communities across the county to feel happy and healthy.

The partnership emerged during the pandemic as an emergency response programme, funded by the National Lottery Community Fund. We delivered thousands of activity packs, digital devices and bursaries to thousands of those most impacted by the pandemic, alongside a free to access online arts programme for people of all ages.

Since 2021, North Yorkshire Together has delivered [FEAST](#), the Holiday Activities and Food

(HAF) Programme in North Yorkshire, on behalf of North Yorkshire County Council, funded by the Department for Education. The HAF programme enables children on benefits-related Free School Meals to access food and enriching activities during the Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays. We work with 100+ brilliant organisations from across the community, educational and private sector, to deliver tens of thousands of free spaces – and meals – a year.

We also deliver enriching activities for [refugees](#) in Northallerton and Selby, and are a partner on [Village Green](#), a three-year project putting communities at the heart of climate action in North Yorkshire

As a partnership of three cross-sector, cross county organisations, our partnership provides a robust, unique and far-reaching framework and delivery model to make real change across North Yorkshire. We believe firmly in our shared values, and the art of the possible.

Rural Arts



We provide over 400 events and activities each year at [The Courthouse](#), **North Yorkshire's only professionally-run, cross-discipline arts centre**, which is also home to an award-winning café, an artisan shop and rooms to hire.

We programme [70 professional performances](#) per year in rural venues and lead a range of [wellbeing and skills programmes](#) to support isolated and vulnerable people. Rural Arts was **founded in 1993** and is an [Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation](#).

About FEAST



FEAST provides holiday activities with healthy meals to children and young people across the Easter, summer and Christmas holidays. All families are welcome to join in, with free places for children and young people who receive benefits-related free school meals.

FEAST is here to help families throughout the school holidays, by providing food and things to do without adding to the growing pressure on income. Each year, over 15,000 children and young people across North Yorkshire are eligible.

FEAST partners with leading activity providers across North Yorkshire to offer a wide range of activities for children and young people from Reception to Year 11. There is so much for families to choose from – take a look at our [fantastic selection of school holiday clubs and activities](#).

North Yorkshire Together coordinates the commissioning of activities each year, working with 80+ community-based organisations to deliver activities that align with the needs and interests of local places – everything from macrame to martial arts!

FEAST is North Yorkshire's [Holiday Activities and Food \(HAF\) programme](#). It is coordinated by North Yorkshire Together, who are commissioned by North Yorkshire Council through funding from the Department for Education.

North Yorkshire is **England's largest county**, spanning over 3,500 square miles – that's three times the size of Luxembourg. 85% of this area is classified as '**super sparse**' due to its intense rurality and low population density.

The county is home to **stunning scenery** and very **friendly folk**. It also faces significant and unique challenges: a '[digital deficit](#)', an older population double the national average and three of England's most deprived wards.

While 78% of people in North Yorkshire live rurally – **four times the national average** – North Yorkshire is home to a number of market towns and is easily accessible from towns and cities in neighbouring counties. You can **find out more about North Yorkshire** [here](#).

The Role: Schools & Families Engagement Manager (FEAST)

This is an exciting opportunity to lead the coordination of how schools, youth settings and families engage with FEAST.

We're looking for someone with exceptional **project and relationship management skills**, who is skilled at partnership working and managing large volumes of data/communications. Experience working with **schools and youth groups** is necessary, but **this is not an activity delivery role**. You will have an understanding of community-based youth provision and how schools work. An ideal candidate would have experience and confidence running focus groups and consultation with children and young people, but training can be provided.

You will ensure high awareness of and engagement in FEAST from schools, youth settings and families. This will include directly liaising with these audiences to support FEAST's adoption and development. From time to time, you will also work directly with holiday activity providers to shape and/or improve their offer in response to young people's feedback.

Whilst a developmental role, shaping FEAST in service of better engaging schools, young people and their families, you will also undertake significant administration and project management, for example maintaining databases, distributing information and responding to enquiries. This requires a strong ability in all Microsoft Office packages, in particular Word, Excel, Outlook, SharePoint and PowerPoint. You will have strong written skills, being able to contribute accurate and high-quality information into management and funder reports as required. Presentation and communication skills are required to meet with and engage young people, their schools/groups and holiday activity providers.

You will need to manage competing demands, have good attention to detail and an ability to communicate effectively with internal and external stakeholders, representing both FEAST and North Yorkshire Together.

Whilst you will be directly employed by North Yorkshire Youth, you will work as part of 'Team FEAST' on a daily basis. This includes collaborating with, and having some work set and directed by, colleagues from North Yorkshire Council, North Yorkshire Sport and Rural Arts.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

1.	To lead the coordination of school, young people and family participation and engagement with FEAST, the Holiday Activities and Food programme for North Yorkshire
2.	To provide strategic input to the direction of travel and forward development of FEAST's engagement with schools, young people and families
3.	To provide project and relationship management, leading Team FEAST's engagement with schools, young people and families
4.	To execute a broad range of duties relating to the participation and engagement of schools, young people and families in FEAST, including but not limited to: research, communication (email, telephone, face-to-face), database management, administration and analysis, presentation and training, facilitation/consultation
5.	To create and develop, where required and achievable, focus groups, pilot projects and improvements to the FEAST programme and processes, in service of improving schools, young people and family participation in and engagement with the programme.
6.	To lead on equity, diversity and inclusion within FEAST, being an advocate and knowledge resource for children and young people that face additional barriers or disadvantage.
7.	To produce information (written, statistics or imagery) for presentations, management and funder reports, where required
8.	To work in partnership, with both internal and external stakeholders, to develop FEAST and improve participation and engagement.
9.	To take initiative and self-direct (as required and within the remit of the role), to manage competing deadlines and demands.
10.	To work collaboratively, positively and effectively across Team FEAST, which is a remote team that comes together twice a month.
11.	To promote equal opportunities (in terms of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, disability and other forms of discrimination) through all aspects of North Yorkshire Youth and North Yorkshire Together's work.
12.	To ensure the Safeguarding needs of all young people are managed in accordance with the recognised policies and procedures, escalating concerns appropriately.
13.	To work within all other policies and procedures as confirmed to you by North Yorkshire Youth and North Yorkshire Together
14.	To uphold and embody the mission, vision and values of North Yorkshire Youth and North Yorkshire Together.
15.	To undertake other duties commensurate with this role, which may be required to further the work of North Yorkshire Youth and/or North Yorkshire Together.

An understanding of marketing and communications from the perspective of young people
Strong written, presentation and communication skills, with strong attention to detail
Ability to manage competing deadlines and demands
Ability to communicate effectively with internal and external stakeholders, using tact, diplomacy and constructive challenge where appropriate
Ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues across different organisations, many of whom you will largely work with remotely
Ability to take initiative and self-direct, with a willingness to learn and take on new tasks.

What We're Offering: Terms, Conditions and Benefits

Annual Salary: £28,000 per annum, pro-rata (equivalent to £22,400)

Hours: 30 hours per week, to be worked across a minimum of 4 days, Monday – Friday. Occasional weekend and/or evening work may be required. Time Off in Lieu is given.

Employment type: Fixed term, most likely until 31st March 2029

Annual Leave: 25 days per annum, pro-rata (equivalent to 20) plus 8 Bank Holidays, pro-rata (equivalent to 6.4)

Place of Work: Your usual place of work will be North Yorkshire Youth's base, Carlton Lodge, in Carlton Miniott, Thirsk. From time-to-time you will also co-work with FEAST Team members at their respective offices (North Yorkshire Council, North Yorkshire Sport and Rural Arts). You will also spend some time on-site at schools and youth groups.

Training and development: Annual training plus the opportunity to participate in wider North Yorkshire Together / partner organisation staff training.
